Key Sailing with Gary and Debbie

Gary and I try to head somewhere warm during the winter and this year Florida was our pick. We rented a cute one bedroom apartment on Conch Key that came with a 23 ft sail boat for our use whenever we wanted. Great! But the warm weather we were expecting in Florida was still in Colorado. Daytime temps were only in the 60's until the day we returned for home. Then they jumped back to their normal 80's, of course!

Oh, Well... We put on our jackets and sailed anyway. It was a little breezier than I like but we went our every morning and afternoon except one day, when because of high winds and small craft warnings, we drove to Key West instead. Good choice don't you think?

The days of sailing were mostly sunny and we saw several Loggerhead Turtles and a Leatherback Turtle swimming beside us. They were so large and beautiful to see but they immediately dove under once they saw the boat.

We also decided to sail to the Everglades using a chart and markers for navigation to avoid shallows and sand bars. That was a good learning experience for us and we did well, considering our first day out we ran aground on a sand bar returning to our dock. (We were able to get the boat off with the help of fellow boaters and no damage was done to the fragile Key environment.) The week was just enough to make us anxious for spring and summer weather to reach the waters around home. So, until then, our memories of sailing in the Florida Keys will have to do.

Welcoming Community Network
