Living Out Our Covenant

A Pastoral Message

President Veazey, in his address to our global church, thanked those who participated in dialogue about *Conditions of Membership*. Many of you remember we had a Fifth Sunday Forum where we shared in small groups our thoughts, attitudes, and beliefs about how already baptized Christians could become members of Community of Christ. We had those same Listening Circles at Glacier View Family Camp and RMMC Fall Conference. What was most meaningful to me was the **deep listening** we experienced. Many of us listened to opinions that differed completely from our own, but the emphasis was not about “being right,” but on being fully present in loving listening with one another. I was struck by the openness of mind that prevailed in “holy listening,” and since that time I’ve wondered if this is what Paul meant when he described “putting on the mind of Christ.” I am grateful that Community of Christ challenges us to be known as a **prophetic people**, rather than as a people with a prophet. In being invited to ponder healthy change and to consider new perspectives, we as members and friends of the church are treated with a kind of dignity and respect not always found when decisions were made from a more top-down hierarchical process.

Prior to World Conference, April 11–17, we are again asked to study and pray for discernment about the content of the **Words of Counsel** brought by President Veazey,

printed in the February *Herald*. One of the unique things about our denomination is our willingness to grapple together to discern the will of God for *this time and place*. This counsel addresses issues that will influence how we make future decisions within a global church, as well as how we look at a very broad spectrum of relationships. I urge you to read it prayerfully, paying special attention to the “principles of Christ-like love” described in paragraph 6a. On March 21 at 5:30 p.m. Tim Ashburn, RMMC president, invites us to join him here in Ft. Collins to discuss this document in more depth. This is *not* to explore Conference resolutions, but to focus on a deeper understanding of the document that will be presented at World Conference.

And last, but certainly not least, as a congregation, we have officially been offered an opportunity to walk together in a year-long process of spiritual discernment to align ourselves with the will of God for our own congregation. Shandra Newcom is willing to spend time with us in a focused way that has not been available before. On January 24, in her Sunday morning message, as well as at our Simple Soup Supper evening, February 16, Shandra challenged us to discover our specific giftedness and sense of call as we seek to live out the Covenant of Welcome we have adopted. As your pastor, I witness a longing among you to more consciously become a “sanctuary of peace” in Fort Collins. As we prepare for Easter, let us walk courageously toward sharing new life and hope as a Community of Christ.

Puppet Ministry Inquiry Results

It has been decided, at least for the present, not to pursue the Puppet Ministry potential. From the 50 mailings made, preceded by the February Communicator article, nine adults replied as interested and one youth. We greatly appreciate the replies made and will keep the names of these interested persons on file just in case interest should change in the future.

World Ministries Contribution Update

The church received an estimated \$690,000 in World Ministries Mission Tithes in January, 5% more than the budgeted income for the month. Over the period of October through December, giving declined so significantly that projected tithing income for the year changed from 6% over budget to 3% under budget. With this one month of improved giving, tithing income is now projected to be \$200,000 less than is needed to meet the budget.

We still need contributors to give very generously in order to meet the year's tithing requirement of \$9.8 million. The mission of Jesus Christ is what matters most for the journey ahead, and your financial support helps make that happen—in your local congregation and throughout the world.
