World Church response to religious intolerance on next page.

Statement from the First Presidency

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As a people who experienced religious persecution, we are alarmed by the growing tide of religious fear, intolerance, and violence evident throughout the world. We join our voices with other religious leaders to denounce any religious persecution and specifically anti-Muslim actions, such as Dove World Outreach Center in the USA, which planned to burn the Qur'an on September 11. Such attitudes, behaviors, and actions reflect hatred rather than Christ's example of love; divide rather than break down walls that separate people; and ignore Christ's call for his disciples to be peacemakers, ambassadors of reconciliation, and advocates for justice.

We challenge you to speak out against religious intolerance and actions that damage relationships and are contrary to Christ's example of love and mutual respect. Led by the Holy Spirit, members and friends of Community of Christ must work with God and others to restore peace to creation and create communities of Christ's peace and justice in our families and congregations and across villages, cities, tribes, and nations.

Homeless Gear Update



In September we introduced a new Pack ID program to the homeless in Fort Collins. We will give out free ID tags for day packs and backpacks that have preprinted on the back: "If found please return to the Murphy Center For Hope 242 Conifer Street FC" If a pack is lost or confiscated, we are hoping to reunite their valuable belongings to the owner. The Murphy Center and the FC police department are participating in the program.

We have surpassed our 2009 total distributions for "Big 8" items (sleeping bags, shelters, footwear, coats, blankets, day packs, backpacks, sleeping-bag pads). In 2009 we distributed a total of 6,682 of these items and so far in 2010 we have already given out 6,747. We are working hard to reach our 2010 goal of 10,000 units. Of course these are only 8 of 40+ items that we collect and distribute.

On a recent Saturday, the Children In Need team (and so many awesome volunteers) served 56 homeless and near homeless families and 283 family members at our monthly distribution. This month's distribution included school supplies, clothing, footwear, hygiene products, and household items.

We continue to send product to over 30 facilities and agencies around the state that serve the homeless. Recently we sent product to facilities in Durango, Glenwood Springs, Denver, Longmont, and Boulder.

Our Children In Need program is now working with the Greeley School District, and we are beginning to send product to them for the many homeless and near homeless children and families in that community. We sent a load of essentials (blankets, socks, underwear, coats, etc.) in support of the people who have lost their homes to the fires in the Boulder area. Many of these people had to evacuate without being able to take anything with them.

We will be stocking the new Loveland Day Shelter with backpacks, sleeping bags, tarps, hats, gloves, socks, and thermal underwear starting November 1. These products will be distributed to the homeless of Loveland through day-shelter trained staff using a similar model that we have in place at the Murphy Center in Fort Collins.

We will be providing product for the third year to the Veterans Stand Down in Fort Collins which is a one day event to bring aid and resources to homeless veterans in our region.

Thanks to all of our many volunteers, businesses, and community groups that make this all happen. This is truly a community organization, and together we are working hard to provide aid to people in need throughout the state.
