"Becoming an Inclusive Community"



Ft. Collins Community of Christ says a big THANK YOU to Lindsay Melsen from Lambda Community Center for facilitating the workshop, "Building an Inclusive Community" for our Fifth Sunday Forum on January 30th! Lindsay invited us to share how we feel when we encounter words like "pity," "tolerance," and "acceptance." Participants shared that being pitied is not a good feeling, and that self-pity is also self-defeating. Lindsey helped us realize that even the word "acceptance" sometimes comes with an unspoken "but." "I accept you, but..." does not feel welcoming. It became clear that, even though we want to be intentionally welcoming to those often marginalized because of race, ethnic background, social status, sexual orientation, marital status—to name just a few—it is normal to sometimes feel awkward.

Lindsay also helped us see the importance of examining underlying attitudes. In order to truly "embrace" each person as a person of worth, we learned that first embracing our need to change helps a lot! Perfection is not required, and, of course, we don't want to "walk on eggshells" to never make mistakes.

The encouraging outcome was that there was a desire for further discussion and many statements of gratitude for the opportunity to learn more about becoming truly inclusive!

The workshop was followed by a brief devotion where we turned to scripture to experience some of the attitudes Jesus expressed in what are called "the beatitudes." Dave Simons and Shari Smith read ancient and contemporary versions of how Jesus described being blessed, found in Matthew's Sermon on the Mount. Hopefully, we will treat ourselves to the same kind of tune-up we give our cars if they are to serve us well. Looking to see what Jesus said and did proved to be a "scriptural tune-up!"
