"Lift Up Mine Eyes"

A year ago we took a picture of our then three-year-old grandson on a mountain pathway. He was looking up at Grandpa with those trusting, blue, toddler eyes and asked, "Where are we going, Gumpa Gumpa?"

Recently it got me to thinking, where do we put our trust? Who do we look up? Who looks up to us? Do we trust ourselves? Do we rely on God to make all of our decisions? A number of years ago, during my days as a youth minister, I overheard one of our young men remark, "I rely on God for all my decisions. I don't even put on a shirt each morning without first asking God, which one?" Where does our stewardship of choice come into focus?

In recent weeks the adult class has been considering collaborative kingdom building. That concept certainly calls into question our personal stewardship. God has the idea but is dependent on human skills and effort, inspired by the Spirit's presence, to accomplish kingdom reality. Jesus announced the presence of the kingdom, but it was obviously an on-going

enterprise. Too often it is said that God's kingdom will come only when Jesus returns or ushers in the kingdom in spite of the human condition. Does that mean it is a forced issue? The chances are very good that the Christ will not do now what he refused to do 2,000 years ago.

So the question then arises: In whom do we place our trust to make the kingdom happen? Is it you? Is it me? The answer is "YES." But it does require a passion for the task. Where do our passions lie? When I look up at you, standing beside me, holding my hand, will I discover a passionate gaze that says "I'm here. I'm ready. Let's get on with the task of making the kingdom happen—for real—here and now!"

"Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself to have grasped it fully even now. But I do concentrate on this: I forget all that lies behind me and with hands outstretched to whatever lies ahead I go straight for the goal—for the prize of the high calling in Christ Jesus."
