Getting to Know You!

Why Fort Collins?

Many years ago when Brian was serving as the Youth Leader for Omaha/Council Bluffs, the Entwistles adopted a boy named Aaron. He has spent a lot of his life moving about with Brian and Vera (they have traveled in at least 17 countries). Now he says it is their turn to move with his family—i.e., he and his wife, Jody, and their two children. But the story is a bit more complicated—recently Aaron searched out his "birth mother" and as a result, found the added bonus of a step-sister and a stepbrother who looks a whole lot like Aaron. The two "brothers" bonded to such an extent that the step-brother, who incidentally lives in Greeley, urged that Aaron's family move from Australia to this area. So since Aaron's family is moving to the USA in February, it would be a long way away from Grandma and Grandpa Entwistle; thus, Fort Collins Congregation is the winner!

Camp Quality

Synonymous with Camp Quality is the name of Vera Entwistle, because since 1983, Vera has devoted 120 percent of her time to organizing the camps; training the volunteer companions; seeking funding from various places such as Rotary Club, Lions Club, and corporate sponsors [including donations from Newman's Own Trust]; and finding locations in 19 different countries for over 50 camps. For instance, there are 15 active Camp Quality sites in the USA, 7 camps in Canada and 14 in Australia. So what is Camp Quality—it is a very special camp for kids with cancer that allows them to escape from their daily medical treatments and just be kids. The companions have a 1-on-1 relationship with their particular charges from which lasting friendships grow as well as friendships between the campers.

Vera says that she put away her oils and her love of painting to devote her creative energies to these camps. Those who have had any contact with the results from a Camp Quality appreciate the miracles that she has accomplished. Fittingly, she has been properly recognized by the Governor General with the highest honor of Australia, the Order of Australia, so that she can be called Vera Entwistle, O.A.M.

From her earlier years in Australia, Vera developed an appreciation for the unique character of the gum trees and even attended a workshop with "Artists of the Bush" and now she is looking forward to unpacking her oils and exploring "Autumn Aspen" time as well other aspects of the mountains here.

Relocation Adjustment

When asked how they were adjusting, they indicated that there were some things that presented challenges-for instance, THE WEATHER after coming from the very temperate climate of Sydney to face snow, ice, etc. [Wait 'til they experience a HAIL storm!] Amazingly they have already bought a house just off the Overland Trail and a car, but there are other logistics of the move- credit ratings, driver's test, and awaiting their overseas container. They said that they will particularly miss the ocean, but the mountains are a reasonable compensation. Then there is the droll Australian humor-when faced with an angry person, they say "Don't get off your bike!"

As regional assistant for Australia with Community of Christ, Brian traveled extensively during his 10 years under church appointment in Australia. Living in the Sydney area, they loved the amazing Sydney Harbour, especially the sights around the Opera House. It is such a joy just to take in the dramatic scenery around the harbor. Among their many precious memories of the years in Australia are the times when they each had an opportunity to carry the Olympic Torch— Vera on the last stop before the stadium of the Sydney Olympics and Brian through the streets of Sydney for the Greek Olympics (they have their torches to prove it).

What are their plans for the holiday period?

They have very dear friends, the Benedicts, living in Oregon. The two families shared many holidays when the Benedicts were teaching in Indonesia. Brian also studied for his graduate degree in Oregon. So we are lucky that they did not opt for Oregon instead of Fort Collins!
