"Everyone Does It"

From the mouths of our children, our coworkers, or our neighbors, those three words are used to justify actions that are unsafe, illegal, or immoral. Children are bullied into shoplifting or smoking by their peers. Friends gather for drinks after hours to drown their troubles before driving home. Neighbors huddle behind their own doors with secrets of infidelities. All justified because "everyone does it."

A church member in Florida, who is a recovering alcoholic, gave a testimonial and said, "A thief thinks everyone steals and an alcoholic thinks everyone drinks." His rational was because everyone drank, then it must be okay.

When I was younger I often heard, "Just because someone jumps off a bridge doesn't mean you have to jump too." (That was before bungee jumping.) You see, I would make decisions to do things that weren't very wise: I rode in speeding cars, I stayed out late past my curfew, and I lied about where I was, all because I wanted to "fit in." I told my parents "but everyone does it." I was a follower.

I have read that only 3 percent of people are trendsetters. The rest are followers. We are a society of "followers" and find strength in the mob of "everyone." We might choose to follow for a sense of belonging, to be popular—a reason common with our youth. Or we join certain political parties, because we hope they will bring our favored leader into power.

This makes being a follower sound rather negative, but it can also be positive to belong to a larger group. If the group has good beliefs and moral compasses, we can benefit from the strength of their numbers. The friend in Florida found strength in the local AA group and is no longer drinking. We, as members of Community of Christ, find strength to stand against injustices done to others.

Jesus wants us to be followers, his followers, his disciples. He said, "Follow me." (Mark 2:11)

"And they, believing on his words, left their nets, and straightway followed him." (Matthew 5: 19)

"Be ye therefore followers of God, as dear children." (Ephesians 5:1)

"And ye became followers of us, and of the Lord, having received the word in much affliction, with joy of the Holy Ghost." (I Thessalonian 1:6)
