I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.—Isaiah 43:19

In the end, this is the most hopeful thing any of us can say about spiritual transformation: **I** cannot transform myself, or anyone else for that matter. What I can do is create the conditions in which spiritual transformation can take place, by developing and maintaining a rhythm of spiritual practices that keep me open and available to God.

ur mission is to faithfully witness of Jesus Christ so that our relationship with God can be nurtured.

These are the opening lines of our new mission statement (see above). God tells Isaiah in chapter 43 that God is about to do a new thing. We in Fort Collins are about to do a new thing, but to do so we must first realize that it is not us but God who does the transforming in us, as Ruth Haley Barton reminds us.

If we are to be nurtured by God and spiritually transformed, then we must create the conditions in which that transforming can take place.

A few years ago some in our congregation began a few years ago to use a daily meditation book from Upper Room Books, and they continue to use it. Some use the *Daily Bread* published by our own denomination. Others read Richard Rohr's daily meditations sent by email. There are a multitude of resources available to help us create space in which God's transforming spirit can meet us.

We have been encouraged by the church to pray the mission prayer each day. "God, where will your Spirit lead today? Help me be fully awake and ready to respond. Grant me courage to risk something new and become a blessing of your love and peace."

If we are to increase our commitment as people and as a congregation to witness faithfully of Jesus Christ, we need to commit to building a deeper relationship with God. We can do that individually and corporately. It may mean doing some things that create feelings of uncomfortableness, because the work of building relationships and community is sometimes very uncomfortable. But it can also be the most rewarding thing we do.

We have a very blessed congregation but one that is also aging. Can we attract younger disciples? How might we do things differently? Who will be willing to accept leadership responsibilities for 2017? Who of us will be willing to follow the Spirit today? Who will risk something new this year? Who is ready to respond? Who will develop the spiritual practices necessary to create sacred community? Will we do a new thing?
