I think they would have called family members and a few close friends. They might have called a few former friends to apologize and mend fences for past squabbles.

I like to think they would have gone out for a Hawaiian or American dinner or for whatever their favorite food was.

I'm guessing; I'll never know.

It's those little things left undone that would make me upset if I knew my hours were limited. Upset because I hadn't written certain letters that I intended to write one of these days. Upset and sorry that I didn't tell my wife and children often enough how much I truly love them. I'm trying very hard not to put off, hold back, or save anything that would add laughter and luster to our lives.

And every morning when I open my eyes, I tell myself that it is special. Every day, every minute, every breath truly is a gift from God.
