"To everything there is a season, a time for every purpose under heaven."—Ecclesiastes 3:1

Spring is the season to look at the changes in nature and our reconciliation with God. Every shooting leaf tell us that God is waiting for us to return to him. Every budding branch tells us of the love and mercy of God.
