Observe how the lilies of the field grow. Matthew 6:28

I received this observation from a friend who has given me permission to share it here. —Rich Kohlman

Today I was working on the east side of the house in some very hard ground where a flower garden had been started last year. The weeds won out and the ground was covered with so many dead weeds that it looked like someone had scattered straw all over it. As I removed the dead weeds, flowers were beginning to peep through the hard ground. I realized the weeds that had choked the life out of the flowers before, had become a blanket over the winter to protect the bulbs that my daughter had planted for me last fall. The weeds had protected the flowers from the cold and from the shingles that were thrown off the roof when we redid it, and from the caulking and wood that was falling all over the place when we installed a

new window. I realized that while I thought the weeds had destroyed my lovingly tended garden, the weeds had in the end protected my flowers, which were now beginning their spring resurrection.

I realize that God tends to us ever more. God also sees the weeds among the flowers. Despite the fact that weeds keep coming up in my garden, I will keep tending them because I love them. So God keeps tending me. The flowers did not know that the weeds that had tried so desperately to kill them last year ended up protecting them from many things. I am assured that while forces are working to destroy us, God can find a way to use what appears to be failure to work for our good. As my tears at times watered the flowers, so I know that heaven's tears water the earth daily. My tears held love and pain and watered the flowers. God's tears water all the earth, and I know they too are filled with love and pain.

I'm afraid that too often we leave the deeps of life untouched not because we remember they are sacred but because we forget they are there.

From Your Facilities Management Team

HVAC Air Duct Cleaning:

Just to give everyone a "heads up," Doc's Super Vac will be cleaning the HVAC air ducts in our facility May 20-24, 2019. This is the first step in trying to improve airflow throughout our building and to reduce odors that exist.

Basement Floor Maintenance:

A.R.C. Incorporated, our cleaning service company, will be cleaning, recoating, and buffing the basement vinyl tile floors on Monday, April 8, 2019. The basement area will be "closed" when this work is being done.

Exterior Building Lighting:

Fixture selection is almost complete. Electrical tie-in points for existing and new fixture locations are being evaluated.

Interior Building Hallway Lighting:

A fixture design has been determined, but the manufacturer remains to be selected.

Building Air-Conditioning Replacement/Additions:

Two vendor proposals are being evaluated. Since the proposals are somewhat different in nature, questions are being asked of each vendor in order to get the proposals to be as near equal as possible in content. Once a vendor has been selected, this project will need to be presented to the Mission Center and the World Church for approval to proceed.

Sanctuary Lighting:

Although this project has not yet been submitted to the Mission Center and World Church for approval, we have been evaluating various lighting fixtures to see how they might enhance the sanctuary. In order to minimize construction costs, the current thought is to look at installing "flat panel" LED fixtures with the same approximate footprint as the existing fluorescent lighting fixtures. It is said that this will give a "skylight effect" to our sanctuary. **Foyer Entrance Doors:**


The basic framework for the foyer entrance doors has been completed with input from the door vendor and the Facilities Management Team. Two glass window designs have been selected for consideration. Please submit your preference (Grid "A" Design or Grid "B" Design)


with the reason for your selection to Gary Chatburn at *gary.chatburn@comcast.net* no later than May 1, 2019. You may also contact Gary if you have any questions about the doors and design during your evaluation process.

The two sketches shown are for the west foyer entrance. The larger door (right side) is a swing outward door and is the main door for entering and exiting the building. The smaller "door panel" is a swing out style door, but it will generally be locked in place and used only as needed.

The east foyer door will be a single-entry door like it is now with the framework looking like the large door in the sketches shown here.

When you are thinking about which door-glass design you would prefer, also think about the sanctuary windows. There is a project planned for the future to replace the windows in the sanctuary. It is anticipated that the replacement sanctuary windows will most likely be the same, or similar in design, as the foyer entrancedoors, glass windows.

Once a door window-glass design has been decided upon, a contract purchase order for the doors can then be issued. It will take approximately eight to ten weeks for the doors to be delivered after the vendor receives the purchase order. After the doors have been received, installation of the east and west entrance doors will take approximately two to three days.
