The staff is committed to providing quality youth camps and retreats that affirm a tradition of faith, relationship with Christ, sound theology and calls to discipleship. OUR CAMPGROUNDS

Big spruce campground

Big Spruce Campground is located on the Grand Mesa in Cedaredge, CO. The kitchen/dining hall, restrooms with showers and an open-sided chapel are all centrally located. There is a sand volleyball court, horseshoe pits and rec building with ping-pong tables. Big Spruce has boys and girls dorms with steel bunks, and smaller rooms with either steel or wooden bunks. camp paradise

Camp Paradise is located 25 miles northwest of Wheatland, WY. The kitchen/dining and meeting areas are on the first floor of the lodge. Each of the ten sleeping rooms has a combination of bunk beds and a double bed, and are located on the second floor along with restrooms and showers. Camp Paradise also has a separate bathhouse with handicap accessible rooms and restrooms. Activities include volleyball, softball, horseshoes and several hiking trails. Recreational activities may include hiking on the Mesa, basketball and ping pong tournaments and a day trip to the hot springs of Ouray. Theme classes, crafts and a special camp project will fill up the days while campfires, night hikes and crazy games in the dark will occupy the nights.

camp paradise Junior/Junior High camp

Look forward to the next adventure in the Narnia series - A Horse and His Boy - and spend a fun filled week in the mountains, complete with swimming, hiking, crafts, campfires and day trips. Campers will learn and gain confidence in a supportive environment. The two camps will start out together and then when Junior Camp is over, Junior High Camp will continue through the rest of the week.

senior High camp - Whispering Pines

Come spend a week at Whispering Pines campground in Arizona with campers and staff from California, Arizona and Colorado. Spend the week exploring the SPEC theme *St()ry*, meeting new youth and enjoying the mountains of Arizona. Check out their information at azwhisperingpines.org

International Youth Forum (IYF) will be held at the Community of Christ Temple in Independence, Missouri. The theme is *Discover*. Campers will participate in a meaningful Temple experience including worship, spiritual education, small-group experiences, plus an opportunity to engage with people from other cultures.

International SPECTACULAR (SPEC) will directly follow IYF at Graceland University in Lamoni, IA. The theme is *ST(O)RY*. Campers will spend the week selecting from a variety of classes, playing sports team and individual sports, performing or creating works of art and strengthening your relationship with God in a supportive and diverse environment. International years are especially wonderful time to experience all the fun that SPEC has to offer and engage with young people from around the globe.

Youth camping clothing guidelines:

Each participant in Rocky Mountain Mission Center youth programming will be asked to abide by the following guidelines:

I would like to attend a Community of Christ youth event therefore,

- I will strive to dress appropriately for this Christian event.
- I will wear clothing that covers my undergarments, and fits well without exposing more than my arms, neck, shoulders and legs (shorts mid-thigh length/ at least a 6 inch inseam).
- I will not wear clothing that promotes or advertises alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, racism, sexism, hatred of any group or person, violence, sexual activities or situations, or companies, musicians and other individuals who promote these things.
- I will bring appropriate clothing, shoes, and gear for camp activities, and be ready to wear them when the activities require me to be safe and secure.
- I understand that the director has final say in what may or may not fit these guidelines, and I will respect any requests to comply with these rules.

If I wouldn't wear it to school or if it would make me unsafe then I agree not to wear it at this event. I will welcome and expect respectful, private feedback from staff.

HOW TO REGISTER

There are two ways to register for any of the summer 2018 RMMC Youth camping program events!

- 1. Register through your local congregation's financial officer or designee during the SUPER SUNDAY registration day on **May 6, 2018**.
- 2. Fill out the included registration forms and mail to the Rocky Mountain Mission Center office. Registration forms are also available online at cofchristrm.org, then click on the *Youth and Young Adults* link.

Instructions for Registering:

- Fill out the 2018 Youth Registration Form (available with this mailing, online and from your congregation's CFO or designee)
 SPECIAL NOTES: Under the General Health Information, please *completely* explain if your child answers yes to any of the questions.
- 2. Fill out the Medication Administration Authorization Form
- If your child is not under the care of a physician for any medical condition and is not taking any over the counter or prescription medications, you do not need a Health Care Providers signature. You DO NEED to sign the form yourself and initial the Preventative Creams/Ointments/Sunscreen section if you would like those to be made available to your child.
- If your child is taking any over the counter or prescription medications, you **MUST** fill out the Medication Administration Authorization Form completely **AND** it must be signed by your Health Care Provider (HCP) before any medications can be administered. If you need additional space, feel free to write on the back of the form and have the HCP initial next to each additional medication.
- For each medication listed, all information needs to be filled out, including: Name,
 Dosage, Route, Time and any Special Instructions.
- * Your child's Medication Authorization is good for one year from the date on the form, however, if any medications change the form must be resubmitted with correct information and new HCP signatures.
