Getting to Know Monica Argotsinger



Monica Argotsinger was born in Ames, Iowa. Her parents both worked for Iowa State University. Go Cyclones!! She graduated from Ames High School in 1976 and then went on to Iowa State University where she got her bachelor's degree in elementary education in 1980. That fall, she started her first teaching job in Wray, Colorado as a first grade teacher. It was there that she met Ron. He had just moved to Wray to be the band director for grades 5-12th.

Ron and Monica were married in 1982 in Wray. In 1983, after the birth of their son, Christopher, Monica decided to take on the greatest, hardest and best job of all, being a stay

She facilitated several trips for the band including to London for the New Year's Day parade, two trips to Hawaii for the Thanksgiving parade, and Portland for the Rose Festival Parade as well as many in state competitions and festivals.

After 29 years, Monica retired from teaching in 2020. Her greatest joy comes from spending time with her six grandchildren, Claire, 8, Adalynn, 5, Lily, 3, Jackson, 2, Leo, 2, and Everett, 2. All the boys are from different families, all born in 2022. Another baby boy will join us in March of 2025. We are blessed. She also enjoys fishing and counted cross stitch.

Monica was raised in the Catholic faith. Her parents were strong members who believed in volunteerism. That focus on service has always been a part of her life. Through searching and study, she began to realize that this faith community was the one where she could best serve. She was baptized in 1985 in Yuma. Since that time, she has served the church in many different roles. She currently holds the office of elder and serves as pastor of the Denver congregation. She looks forward to this new challenge as the Mission Center president.



Getting to Know Jon Troyer

As Mission Center Financial Officer, Jon Troyer hopes to continue his service to God, the church and the mission center to help bring others into a closer relationship with God and into a loving community of brothers and sisters in Christ. Born in Loveland in 1981, and after a year stint in Maine for 1st grade, the remainder of his youth was spent in the Fort Collins congregation and he is deeply rooted in Northern Colorado. 

MINUTES OF THE ROCKY MOUNTAIN MISSION CENTER BUSINESS SESSION

Conducted via Zoom: October 14, 2023

Sean Langdon, RMMC President, called the 2023 Rocky Mountain USA Mission Center Business Meeting of the Community of Christ to order at 2 pm MST. He welcomed everyone and thanked them for their attendance. Andy and Jana Horner from Greenwood were asked to lead everyone in a "Moment of Blessing." Sean then called the Annual Business Meeting of the Rocky Mountain Mission Center to Order with the playing of a video "Call to Order" which featured Sean playing a Shofar horn gifted to him as a going away gift by the Mossyrock Congregation in Washington.

Sean introduced the following individuals who would be participating in the business session. Alice Hyatt, taking our minutes; Melanie Grimes as Zoom Host; Richard Betts, Field Support Minister for the Western Field and interim Mission Center Financial Office (also parliamentarian); Jana and Andy Horner; Barbara Gardner, Monica Argotsinger, and Laurie Bunten who are all offering prayers; Gwennan Holloway who will do a scripture reading; and Steve Holloway and Alice Hyatt who will be sharing testimonies regarding their respective priesthood calls.

Attendees were reminded that all are welcome; however, only delegates will have voice and vote for all business actions. Also, all were reminded to be muted unless they are going to be speaking, in which case they should unmute, state their name, and their congregation. If you wish to second a motion, raise your hand (without unmuting). For voting, keep your hands raised until Sean makes it known that all have been counted.

Delegates were asked to turn to pages A3-A5 in the Fall conference brochure to find the minutes of the 2022 Rocky Mountain Mission Center conference. Everyone was given a few moments to look them over. Sean asked for any corrections, additions, or modifications to the minutes. It was noted that Kathi Stanford is spelled with an "I" not "y". Kathi Stanford of Farmington

moved to approve the minutes as submitted. It received a second. Motion passed. Sean stated that even though Apostle Shandra Newcom was unable to attend the meeting, she wanted to send her greetings via a video, which was shown by Melanie Grimes.

The chair was turned over to Field Support Minister Richard Betts. After expressing greetings from Ron Harmon, Richard read a letter from Scott Murphy of the Presidency, recommending that the mission center sustain the appointment of Sean Langdon as Mission Center President. Gail Sundell of Cheyenne moved to approve this appointment and received a second. There was no discussion and the motion carried.

Next Sean asked for a motion to sustain Richard Betts as the interim Rocky Mountain Mission Center Financial Officer and read the letter of appointment on page A7 from Scott Murphy. Donald Weiss of Aurora moved to sustain and received a second to the motion. Motion carried. Sean thanked Richard for continuing in this role as the RMMC interim Financial Officer.

Sean Langdon read the letter found on page A8 from Apostle Shandra Newcom recommending that the conference sustain Travis Savage as the Mission Center Invitation Support Minister. A motion was made by Andy Horner of Greenwood to approve this appointment. It was seconded and the motion carried. Sean thanked Travis for his willingness to serve in the responsibility.

Reference was next made to page A9 which was a letter from Sean Langdon asking for approval to sustain the appointment of the following members to the Leadership Team: Monica Argotsinger, Jandy Barentine, Barbara Gardner, Naomi Barlow, Travis Savage, Melanie Grimes, and Bob Walker – along with Sean and Richard Betts. A motion to approve was made by Donna Seilheimer of Pueblo. It received a second. There was some discussion regarding the procedure for selecting the members of this leadership team. After discussion, the motion to approve passed.

Sean referred next to page A10 that listed the members of the RMMC Council. Sean pointed out

this council consists of the congregation pastors and the Leadership Team. He read the letter and asked for a motion to approve. This was made by Olivia Fisher of Farmington and received a second. Motion carried.

The chair was assumed by Richard Betts for consideration of the proposed 2024 RMMC budget totaling \$236,800. Narrative regarding the budget is contained on page A12-13. Discussion about the budget occurred during the pre-conference session at the morning gathering. No additional discussion was expressed. Mike Mueller of Yuma moved to approve, it was seconded, and then passed.

Page A14 contained the meeting minutes of the Big Spruce Camp Association Meeting on August 29, 2023. At that meeting they approved an amendment to the By-Laws of Big Spruce that allows any officer to be re-elected to succeed themselves so long as they continue to hold office as either an Elected Director or Ex Officio Director on the Board of Directors. (See Page A15). Debbie Stanton of Thornton moved to approve the August 29, 2023, minutes as submitted. It was seconded and the motion passed. Sean thanked Yvonne Grimes for taking the minutes of the Association Meeting.

Election of Big Spruce Campground Board Members was the next item of business and Sean referred to page A16. Group B is up for election. Sean thanked Yvonne Grimes who is terming out at the end of 2023. The board voted at their July meeting to recommend Galvin Gibson, Sharon Osborn, and Naomi Barlow be placed in nomination to serve terms that will expire on December 31, 2026. All three have agreed to stand in nomination. Sean asked for other nominations and none were presented. With no objections raised, Sean declared the three nominated would serve in Group B for terms expiring December 31, 2026.

At this time we entered a time for the presentation of priesthood calls, with a quick 60 second stretch break. Gwennan Holloway read D&C 163:3a-b and 165:4a. Barbara Gardner offered a prayer of preparation. World Church Leadership has approved calls to the office of High Priest

for Steve Holloway and to the office of Evangelist for Alice Hyatt. Biographies are on page A17 and A18. Sean asked for a motion to sustain the call of Steve Holloway to the office of High Priest. Debbie Stanton of Thornton moved to sustain, received a second, and it was passed. Sean stated that since he was not the mission center who processed this call, he read a statement from Joel Cox affirming this call. Richard Betts then read a letter from Apostle Shandra Newcom also affirming this call for Steve. This was followed by Steve sharing his testimony about this call and willingness to accept and serve in this priesthood office. Others shared their support of this call. The motion to sustain carried.

Sean next invited a motion to sustain the call of Alice Hyatt to the office of Evangelist. Angie Brand of Greenwood did make a motion to sustain, and it was seconded. Again, Sean stated this call was processed prior to his becoming the mission center president and read a letter from Joel Cox with his testimony of this call. Richard Betts also read a letter from Apostle Shandra Newcom in support of the call. Alice offered a statement that shared her willingness to humbly accept this call with a desire to serve to the best of her ability with God's help. Once more others offered their testimonies of support for the call. The vote to sustain carried.

Monica Argotsinger offered a Prayer of Gratitude and Support to close the presentation of priesthood calls portion of our business meeting.

Everyone was invited to attend the fellowship and worship gathering in two weeks at Estes Park YMCA where the ordinations of Steve and Alice will take place and Seventy Joelle Wight will be special ministry. The theme of "A Spiritual Venture: Discern, Discover, Do" will be explored at this gathering with special guest ministry by Apostle Shandra Newcom and President of Seventy Joelle Wight. All this will be in celebration of the 20th Birthday of the RMMC.

The meeting was adjourned and a closing prayer was offered by Laurie Bunten.

Rocky Mountain Mission Center **2025 Budget Narrative**

Income

- Conference: Revenue from registrations and offerings collected during Mission Center conference.
- Generous Response: Giving from congregations and individuals. Thank you for your continued support.
- Expansion Fund: This fund is invested in the World Church investment pool and is used to fund approximately 45% of the Mission Center's operating expenses. The Presiding Bishopric has recommended an annual withdrawal rate of 4% to maintain the principle and adjust for the effects of inflation. While this budget represents a 4.5% draw on the 5-year average, we feel it is still appropriate as funds have been added to the Expansion fund this year from property sales. After adjusting the 5-year average for the additional funds, the draw rate is 4%.
- Mission Center Staff Fund: The sale of the Fort Collins building and the congregation's generous contributions to the Mission Center are funding the addition of a full-time Mission Minister for approximately 5 years.
- Youth Ministries Reserve: This includes any proceeds from fundraising events, the grocery card program
 income, any youth program grants from individuals and congregations, and utilizes the balance of the Youth
 Ministry Fund, to help with subsidies and cover the costs of youth activities and events.
- Ministerial Expense Fund: A transfer to utilize the Ministerial Expenses Fund (previously named the Elder's Expenses Fund) to cover ministerial travel and expenses.
- Operating Reserves: This represents additional funds (above the 4% rate) needed to be transferred to balance
 the budget. The 2025 budget balances without the need to transfer additional funds from operating reserves.

Administrative Expenses

- Audit: The amount in 2024 is lower than budgeted because we generously received assistance from the Arizona
 Mission Center to perform the 2023 audit. If the 2024 audit is done in the same way, audit costs will remain low,
 but the future is uncertain, so we are budgeting a higher amount in case it is needed.
- Bank Fees: This line is associated with both banking fees and payroll processing fees.
- Equipment Maintenance: Includes maintenance of computers, copy machine, telephones, and other office
 equipment. This amount includes reserves for replacement,
- **Insurance**: This line includes general liability, workers compensation, and property insurance. While premiums are projected to rise by 15%, our actual costs were quite a bit lower than budgeted for 2024.
- Communications: This line includes office phones, internet, website costs & Zoom fees. The promotional price for internet has expired, so costs will be higher for 2025.
- Office Salaries: This amount remains similar despite currently having one less employee in the office. In lieu of
 an in-house bookkeeper, we have rearranged workloads, assigned tasks to additional people and contracted for
 limited work with an external bookkeeper. We will continue to evaluate the most stewardly and cost effective
 ways to meet the needs of the Mission Center as leadership roles continue to evolve.

Program Expenses

- Conferences and Meetings: The cost of the Mission Center Conference and other programs during the year.
- Expansion Ministries: Funds to host community building events and activities throughout the Mission Center.
- Family and Adult Ministries: As Rockies Family Camp will no longer exist, the Mission Center hopes to support family and adult ministries in many additional ways,
- Family Assistance Reserve Savings: This was a new line added in 2023 to reduce a negative fund balance in
 the Family Assistance Fund. The fund is still running a negative balance, so an amount is included again in 2025.
 We are also budgeting for the likelihood of needed repairs to the condo property in the coming year.
- Leadership Development: Supplements the costs for individuals attending classes, seminars, and retreats.
 The Mission Center also plans to host leadership development events throughout RMMC.
- Young Adult Ministries, Youth Ministry Salary, and Youth Activities and Events: Provides general support for planning and producing youth and young adult programs.

Ministerial Expenses

- Ministerial Expense Reimbursement: Travel and other ministerial expenses.
- Ministerial Salaries: Mission Center ministerial salaries, benefits & 403b contributions. Budget increased to allow hiring of a Mission Minister.
